

- Get permission from your host family

- Choose a high school friend who has an interest in global issues and enjoys exchanging ideas. If you are unsure about whom to invite, talk to your international exchange agency representative, host family, teachers, or your high school counselor for suggestions.

- Complete and return your and high school friend's application form no later than **December 15, 2007** to your exchange agency representative or Iowa Council for International Understanding. (Please note the address below).

- Please include your application fee of \$35 per student. Note that both the exchange student and high school friend need to make payments of \$35 each. Make checks payable to ICIU.

Transportation Information

Transportation may be available for participants who live more than 50 miles from Des Moines, depending on the need. If you need transportation, please indicate it on the application form by choosing one of the pick up locations. (Students who live within 50 miles of Des Moines should make arrangements for transportation.)

If there are sufficient students requesting bus service, three bus routes and stops will be provided. Stops will be made in the order listed. These are based on last year and may change this year depending on the preferred location stated. The return from Des Moines will be in the reverse order listed. **(Please note that routes are subject to change until registration is complete.)**

Northwest Route:

Sioux City → Spencer → Algona → Humboldt → Hampton → Ankeny → Des Moines

Northeast Route:

Waterloo → Urbana → Cedar Rapids → Iowa City → Grinnell → Des Moines

Southwest Route:

Council Bluffs → Gleanwood → Creston → Osceola → Des Moines
